



HAND HYGIENE FOCUS AT BETHESDA HEALTH CARE

As part of the World Health Organisation (WHO) World Hand Hygiene Day on 5 May 2017, Bethesda Health Care is celebrating this important day through staff education, and visitor information about hand hygiene.

WHO's primary focus for 2017 is the fight against antibiotic resistance in the context of hand hygiene and infection prevention and control (IPC) programmes.

At Bethesda Health Care, hand hygiene is one of the key components in the infection prevention and control program, and is central to providing high quality health care.

A large display in the hospital foyer features statistics about hand hygiene and staff dedication to maintaining their commitment to hand hygiene. There is a quiz open to staff and visitors plus a children's colouring-in competition about hand hygiene.

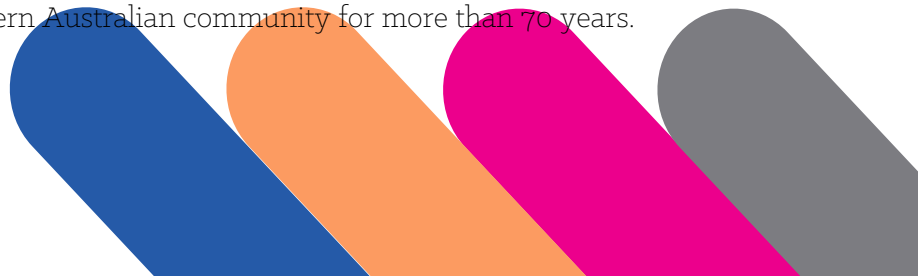
